#### **First Reading**

Acts 10: 25-26,34-35,44-48 Gospel

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last;


and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in







## 9th May 6th Sunday of Easter John

Peter's encounter with the centurion Cornelius marks a turning point in the mission of the early church. Baptism and participation is no longer limited to Jewish Christians only. In the Gospel Jesus continues his theme of 'remaining'. He emphasises the relationship between Jesus and the believer is of love. The chain of love runs from the Father to the Son, and the Son to the believer. This chain is unbroken as long as the believer follows the commandment of Jesus 'to love one another as I have loved you'.

#### **3rd May Saints Philip and James Apostles**

We know almost nothing of these men except Jesus chose them to be part of the 12 pillars of the New Israel, his Church. Philip came from the same town as Peter and Andrew, Bethsaida in Galilee. Jesus called him directly, whereupon he sought out Nathanael and told him of the "one about whom Moses wrote." As in the case of the other apostles, we see in James (not James the brother of John) and Philip human men who became foundation stones of the Church, and we are reminded again that holiness and its consequent apostolate are entirely the gift of God, not a matter of human achievement
