BETTER START LITERACY APPROACH

The Ministry of Education's new reading approach, called 'The Better Start Literacy Approach' is being implemented into our school curriculum with the support of the University of Canterbury and our facilitator Liz Roberts (RTLit).

In class, we will share exciting story books that will enhance vocabulary. We will also be playing games that develop your child's phonological awareness – or their awareness of the sounds within words. This area is particularly important to help your child learn to read and spell. We have also made changes to our reading groups. You may notice a change in the kinds of books coming home. The Better Start Literacy Approach uses carefully chosen texts to provide opportunities to practice reading.

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said:
