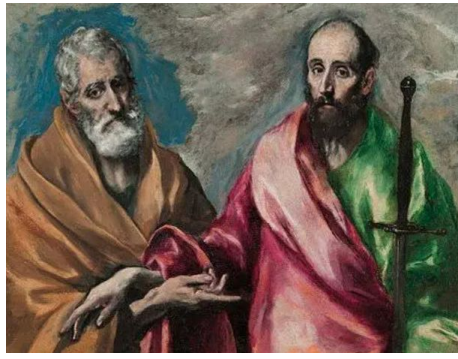
UNIFORMS

Kia Ora Koutou e te Whanau

The church punctuates the liturgical year by celebrating various events important to the mystery of our salvation.

What is the liturgical year? It is a year of celebrating the mystery of Christ, from his incarnation and birth, to His ascension, to Pentecost and finally to the second coming of Christ.

When does the year start? It starts with Advent which is four weeks before Christmas.

On Wednesday it was the feast day of Saints Peter and Paul. It is a day of Solemnity - a celebration of the greatest importance.

Peter and Paul are giants of the Church. Both are apostles. Peter was very likely a middle-aged man when Jesus called him. He was a fisherman from Bethsaida, a village near the Lake of Galilee. Perhaps he was part of a fisherman's co-op with his brother Andrew and friends James and John. Andrew introduced Peter to Jesus. Jesus said, "You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas, meaning Rock.".... and on this rock I will build my Church.

Each year I recall our family trip to Rome where we visited the Scarvi - the site beneath the Vatican that was a pagan burial ground, where Christians began to be buried in the time after Jesus died. Etched into rock is "Here lies Peter". The location of Peter's tomb.

This feast day gives opportunity to all of us to consider where and how faith came to be spread around the world:

How did we receive the message of Jesus?

What does that message mean to me? and

How might we continue to be part of spreading the message especially to our children?

What do I need to know and do to strengthen my relationship with Jesus?

Luke 10:1-2, 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out
ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he
himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich
but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to
send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember,
I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no
purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.

'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be,
"Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there,
your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back
to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink
they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do
not move from house to house.

'Whenever you go into a town where they make you
welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who
are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you."
But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you
welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the
very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it
with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very
near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with
Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said
'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He
said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from
heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot
serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the
enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that
the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names
are written in heaven.'
