Each year Caritas have Social Justice Week. This year the theme is "Say No to Racism We are one in Christ"

The Gospel where Jesus calls us to be a good neighbour, challenges and disrupts our thinking. It is counter cultural in its time and still is today. A good neighbour stops and helps the injured, does not hesitate to accept the responsibility to heal relationships.

We are called to act like Jesus- to wake up, to stand up and to speak when we see racism. We are invited to love our neighbour and write a new parable of justice for our time. **How are we becoming one in Christ??**

Safety Drills

Schools are required to have safety drills as part of the Planning and Preparing for Emergencies, Disasters, and Crisis policy.

Over the past two weeks the school has held a Fire Drill and a Lockdown Drill (some call this a reverse evacuation drill). Both drills were carried out successfully. The students were informed that there was going to be a drill at sometime during that day. Drills are logged in our property compliance folder and the emergency layout plans are linked to the Police emergency plans.

So what communication goes out to parents?

Our Communication During an Emergency Disaster of Crisis policy states that:

- The school, using emergency contact details provided, will inform the school community via
 - txt /phoning
 - o school website and Kiwi Schools app or any social media accounts.

A message may read "there is potential danger in the area and police and ministry have deemed it appropriate the schools go into lockdown"

• Regular updates will be provided.

What is expected of parents?

• Parents/Caregivers must follow any instructions issued by the school including not coming to the school to see or collect their children if advised.

Sunday 11th September 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time



The sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation are offered in the Parish every year.

The sacramental programme is a Parish based programme for the Baptised or those preparing for Baptism as young children.

St Joseph's School is the place where the programme is held.

The programme finishes with a celebration Mass where the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion are conferred on the children by the Bishop of our Diocese.

Usually a meal together follows this celebration Mass in the school basement. It always has a celebration cake, photos and special gifts.

What are the sacraments?



Sacraments

The sacraments are seven meeting points where God himself is present, waits for you, gives you a gift and leads you deeper into the community of the Church



Baptism

From this meeting point onwards, Christ accepts you into communion with himself and the entire Church for your whole life. You become a Christian



Reconciliation

A meeting point which God forgives all your sins and reconciles you with the community



Eucharist

A meeting point in which God gives himself to you as food; you receive the Body of Christ and become a part of the Body of Christ



Confirmation

A meeting point in which God strengthens you with his Holy Spirit for you service in the kingdom of God



Marriage

From this meeting point onwards, God unites the love of a man and a woman with his love



Holy Orders

A meeting point in which God equips men with authority and sends them out.



Annointing of the Sick

The meeting point in which God comes to the aid of those who are sick and have lost their strength

First Reading Exodus 32:7-11,13-14

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!" the Lord said to Moses, 'I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation.'

But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God. 'Lord,' he said 'why should your wrath blaze out against this people of yours whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with arm outstretched and mighty hand? Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, your servants to whom by your own self you swore and made this promise: "I will make your offspring as many as the stars of heaven, and all this land which I promised I will give to your descendants, and it shall be their heritage for ever.""

So the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.

R:. I will rise and go to my father

Second Reading 1 Timothy 1:12-17

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, and who judged me faithful enough to call me into his service even though I used to be a blasphemer and did all I could to injure and discredit the faith. Mercy, however, was shown me, because until I became a believer I had been acting in ignorance; and the grace of our Lord filled me with faith and with the love that is in Christ Jesus. Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. I myself am the greatest of them; and if mercy has been shown to me, it is because Jesus Christ meant to make me the greatest evidence of his inexhaustible patience for all the other people who would later have to trust in him to come to eternal life. To the eternal King, the undying, invisible and only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel (shortened)

Luke 15:1-32

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance.

'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'
