The title on the left is the name of the new Religious Education Curriculum that is beginning to be implemented in schools.

The new RE Curriculum is framed up in the same way as the Curriculum Refresh document and is divided into the new phases of learning rather than the Levels that the curriculum has now. It has four Themes /Te Rama Whakapono.

The current theme is GOOD NEWS / TE RONGOPAI and focuses on the 'joy of the Gospel. In building our local curriculum these themes will be the central focus, within and through which local contexts/stories/experiences that our community consider important, will be placed.

Parables - those open ended, thinking stories that contain so many metaphors drawn from nature or common life are being explored in the classrooms. Ask your children if they can retell one! Creating a parable from your own life stories can be fun too!


30th July 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time


26th July Saints Joachim and Anne

The St Joseph's School Ag Day Committee will have their meeting on Tuesday, 01 August 2023 at 7:30pm.




GRANDPARENTS DAY 2023!!
