Parables are short allegorical stories designed to teach a truth, religious principle, or moral lesson. Jesus's parables used elements of everyday life to illustrate a more profound message.


Parables resonate differently with each of us, and we all may have our favorites. Here are some that stand out as well-known and oft-cited parables of Jesus:



6th August The Transfiguration of the Lord





Our Ag Day (Pet Day) will be held on Thursday, 12 October 2023. That is the first week in Term 4. Registration forms will be available soon!!




GRANDPARENTS DAY 2023!!








It is that time of the year again where we let you all know Miniball will be starting The start date is Wednesday the 6^{th} of September and Thursday the 7^{th} of September.


There are a few changes this year that we are excited to share.

READINGS AND GOSPEL FOR 6th AUGUST - THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD



First Reading

Daniel 7: 9-10,13-14

As I watched:

Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of his head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames, its wheels were a burning fire. A stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. A court was held and the books were opened. I gazed into the visions of the night. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroyed.


Matthew 17:1-9
